REGISTRATION & KICKOFF MEETING

This year we will be going back to an old format of having a mandatory kickoff meeting. In the past we have sent out registration forms with a newsletter with a return envelope and a due date. That has been about 15-20 percent effective. Mostly due to the fact most families are not reading our newsletters. This year's **KICKOFF** meeting will be Sunday February 21, 2010 @ 1:00 pm. This mandatory meeting will be at the Lied Active Center on the Bellevue Public School Administrative campus, 2700 Arboretum Dr. located at the intersection of hwy 75 and Cornhusker Rd. in Bellevue. We all understand family budgets are tight, but we must raise our fees slightly in 2010. We will be offering discount season single and family (more than driver per family) Rally booklets for those who own their own car. It will save you money for those who plan on racing the whole season. We will also for the first time be offering Corporate Car participants an opportunity to sell race day fees sponsorships to be displayed on their cars. Private cars have always been able to do this and have reduced their cost to a bare minimum. If you have a corporate car and are not racing, we will need to make arrangements to pick up the car as soon as possible to allow another family the opportunity to race on June 19-20. We can not wait one week before the local race to find out you are not racing. We understand that some times things come up at the last min, and you must drop. We will refund entry fees up to June 1st. If you have any questions concerning car # or sponsors please call. If you have a car for sale please contact Jerry Van Waart at 347-9702 to help direct prospects to you. It is very difficult to plan, budget, and run a race not knowing what your status is. You need to keep us informed. A quick phone call would be a great help to our race directors.

2010 BASIC INFORMATION OF THE OMAHA AREA SBD ASSOC.

(Just a short review of what we are and how we attempt to do it!)

NEWSLETTERS! We attempt to put out a newsletter about once a month during the year. We will never win any prizes for writing, but we will keep you informed. All we need you to do is **PLEASE READ** it. This is the best way we can keep you informed. The biggest help you can be to us is being on time, honoring the mandatory dates, and **keeping us informed on your racing status**. This year we will be attempting to send our newsletters and reminders thru your e-mail. When you fill out your 2010 registration form make sure that you include a PARENT & DRIVER e-mail address. If you do not have an e-mail we will continue to send out a paper copy for you.

2010 OMAHA AREA LOCAL ALL-AMERICAN RACE The June 19-20 is the only race you are registering for at this time. Winners of this local race will go to Akron in July. Mandatory for Corporate cars!! This race is a two day event. A special consolation race will be run for non place winners.

RALLY RACING Omaha AA Spring Rally will be May 15. **AA Rallies** are for points. The top two or three point earners in all three divisions out of Region IV, who do not win their local, also qualify for Akron. Last year several of the 9 spots in Dist. 4 were from our association. This year 2010 NDR is in Akron, Ohio the last week of July. Plan ahead! **NEVER** go to a rally without making many practice runs prior to the race. **Always** show up on time and ready to race! (alignment, new brake pad, weight check) Our track and scales are open the night before all rallies. Help when ever possible! We will have our under the lights AA Monster Rally Oct. 2-3. Our 2010-11 rally fees will remain the same as 2009.

TRACK USAGE AND SAFETY The track is located in the northwest corner of Seymour Smith Park 72nd and Washington. The track is open 24-7-365 for your use. **Simple safety requirements.** #1. Always walk the track before starting to practice looking for objects and check the car over for tight steering and a good brake pad. #2. **Never** start a first timer from the top. Work them up the hill. #3. If you are using the yellow center line to practice make sure your driver is past the finish line completely before putting on the brake. There is a metal plate on the yellow finish line and you may catch and **bend** your brake plunger. #4. **Never** let a driver go down while there is someone or another car sitting on the track. #5. You should have a second person on the bottom to act as a lookout. #6. Remind drivers to make slow correction and keep **both** hands on the steering wheel at all times especially while braking!.

CORPORATE CARS The association has over 40 cars that have been purchased by clubs or businesses. The 2010 registration fee is \$50 dollars for using a corporate car for the season. If you are using a corporate car there are two dates you are **committed** to. The mandatory inspection date and the June 19-20 local race date. If at any time you cannot fulfill this commitment you need to notify your derby uncle or the board. We will have a waiting list of families wanting to race. It is **very embarrassing** for us when a sponsor shows up to the local race and their car is **NOT** there. If you are a first timer family with a corporate car you and the driver must take the time to break the car down and reassemble to 2010 plans and comply per-plan. You are allowed to race this car in rallies in Omaha or other area race cities. You are responsible for the cost to rally. The driver who is registered to race in the local June 20-21 is the **ONLY** driver who can use the car in an All-American Rally. If the car is being used in an NDR Rally another person can use the car for that race only. This car must be stored **inside, dry, and secure place**. The family must maintain this car in good working order and replace any damaged items. Arrangements must be made to keep the car covered when transporting in foul weather, or sitting out a rain delay at a rally. **WATER SOAKED CARS ARE TOAST!!! A CORPORATE CAR NEW IS OVER \$600 DOLLARS NOT COUNTING WHEELS!!!**

DERBY UNCLES All participants will be assigned a Derby Uncle. This along with your newsletter will be our way of keeping you informed and updated. This person can also be a resource to aid in assembly or timely racing tips. Remember there are no dumb derby questions, you have to start somewhere! Trust me, we all have put the steering in backwards more than once.

RACE DAY PROCEDURES All of our races will be a double elimination lane and 2-4 wheel swap race to the top 8 places. To be eliminated from the days competition you must lose two heats. One in the winners side of the bracket and one in the challengers side of the bracket. The exception would be if you are racing off for 5-6-7-8 places. To win or lose a heat you must go down the hill with your opponent twice. A timer at the finish line will be started as the first car crosses the finish line and stopped as the second car breaks the beam. That will give the winner a 1st. phase time differential. Both cars will be taken back to the top where the cars will be blocked up and all four wheels will be exchanged spindle for spindle. Care should be taken to not turn the wheels around or setting them down on the ground. Only the car handler and driver should handle the wheels. Replace and check wheel pins and go to the start ramps and line up in the opposite lane than the first phase. Second phase racers have priority on the ramp. We do not want long periods of time between phases of heats. The second phase is raced and a second time differential is taken. The car with the greater differential is the over all winner and advances in the bracket. Prior to going to the scale for the first phase two wheels will be swapped. All your wheels should be marked with your name, or car # and the direction you are running them. You can use washers inside and out. You should check your wheels and your opponent wheels to make sure that their wheels do not rub against your air foils. If you have older bearings that are loose and move out during racing, they will need to be fixed or replaced to insure fair and equitable racing for both cars in a heat!!

PROMOTIONS & RECRUITMENT The association does not have a large budget for promotion or large scale recruitment programs. The best source to get the message out about the program is our membership. We have one of the larger races in the Nation. We would like to continue to grow. To do this we need to have each member recruit a new race family. If you know of any family interested please have them contact Jerry Van Waart at 347-9702. We will have a display at the car show in March and we will need some help in manning the display and answering questions. Please call and volunteer !!

PER-PLAN ASSEMBLY It is your responsibility and commitment to review changes and updates to confirm that your car is in compliance. There are some changes in 2010 for all three divisions, and clarifications. Some are mandatory and others are optional. It is very important that the car is updated before the rally season starts in April. The 2010 plans are posted on the All-American web site (aasbd.org). You can and should download a copy.
